- Over 40,000 books given to over 32,000 students, their classrooms, and their school libraries.
- Over 700 author and/or illustrator in-school and afterschool presentations for students in Head Start through high school.
- Two additional AOB programs: book groups and Little Free Libraries in schools.
- Two full-time and two part-time staff, plus volunteers.

WHO WE SERVE


n Open Book Foundation serves students in schools in the Washington DC metro area in which at least 50% of the students qualify for the Federal Free and Reduced-price Meal System (FARMS), a common poverty marker which correlates with low literacy levels. The schools with which AOB works average an 85% FARMS rate.

During the 2014-15 school year, An Open Book Foundation:

- More than doubled the number of students served since our first full year.
- Expanded our presence in Head Start programs and in high schools.
- Nearly tripled the number of schools served since our first full year.

The books provided during AOB events are often the first book the child has ever owned.


STUDENTS SERVED





STUDENTS BY GRADE LEVEL





n Open Book Foundation's unique program inspires children to read by introducing them to the authors and illustrators who created the books we give them to keep. This bond is further strengthened after the event, when the author engages in a conversation with each student while personalizing the student's book. Such a unique and memorable experience means that the student forms a personal connection to the author *and* to the book.

Children's and teens' authors and illustrators are critical to the success of AOB. The number of participating authors has more than doubled since 2011-12, AOB's first full year. These authors and illustrators demonstrate their dedication through their interactions with young people at AOB events, acting as mentors and teachers in art, writing, science, civics and history. Their growing dedication to An Open Book helps us reach a growing number of schools and students.


Initially, AOB took authors and illustrators to one school where they presented to one group of students. Today, more authors are devoting an entire day to a school and presenting to two or three classes. Some authors are visiting more than one school in a day or returning for a second day. And more authors request visits with AOB whenever they visit the DC area.



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
