ur team started the 2023-24 school year at the Library of Congress Literacy Awards ceremony where AOB was recognized as one of 15 honorees for our "successful implementation of a specific literacy practice." We welcomed three new board members whose experience and skill sets align with AOB's needs and seven new volunteers who assisted at school and outreach events. C.W. Harris Elementary School kindergartners became our third cohort school group—over the next six years, these students will participate in the entire range of AOB programming.
